#### Focus On ... Listener Liaison

Our listener liaison team, headed up by Imogen Waterson and assisted by Beverley Hopkins, are the first port of call for new and existing listeners.

They receive referrals from friends, family and social services as well as the various blind and partially sighted support organisations in Norfolk.

The first step is a phone call to the prospective listener to arrange a visit. They always call first to allow the listener to arrange for a support person to be present.

They explain who we are and how we work and seek agreement to store their personal details in our dispatch computer. A listening device is provided free of charge and time is taken to ensure they can operate it confidently.

The listener details are passed to our Copy and Dispatch Coordinator who arranges for them to be added to our listener database and for a welcome message to be included in the next edition.

The rest, hopefully, is automatic!

Well, apart from chasing up when postal wallets don't come back and driving across the region when problems occur.
